



RANELAGH SCHOOL – PRESS RELEASE A-LEVEL RESULTS 2019

Year 13 students at Ranelagh School continue to maintain the school's strong academic success in the sixth form with another super performance in 2019. 60% of grades were awarded at A*-B (or equivalent), with 29% of all grades at A and A* (or equivalent). The overall pass rate was 98%. Once again students have shown their ability to be independent learners who are resilient and able to perform under pressure.

24% of our Year 13 students achieved grades AAB or better. Two students have successfully gained places at Oxford and Cambridge; Susannah Ames (PPE, Oxford) and Alice Remmington (English, Cambridge).

With regards to destinations, courses chosen range from Computer Science, History, Law and Philosophy to Aerospace Engineering, Speech and Language Therapy and Video Games Digital Art; once more showing the ambitious and diverse range of choices that studying in the Ranelagh Sixth Form enables students to make.

For our students who have, at this point, chosen not to attend university, some have taken up high-quality apprenticeships, whilst others have gone into employment or are taking an opportunity to undertake voluntary work or travel as part of a gap-year.

Headteacher, Beverley Stevens, was delighted "It has been a very exciting morning as, along with their excellent results, we have received confirmation from our students of their destinations. We encourage them to be ambitious and it is wonderful to learn that the majority of them can now begin preparing for the next steps, including many embarking upon a whole range of interesting courses at Russell Group universities and exciting apprenticeship opportunities with companies like Ernst and Young and BP."
