



Ranelagh Charter - Our Actions

This charter, negotiated and agreed by staff and students, sets out the **actions** of all members of the community **to support access to rights** from the **UN Convention of the Rights of the Child** for everyone.

Students

Articles 28 & 29: The right to education and personal development

- ✓ Get involved
- ✓ Complete all classwork and homework to the best of your ability
- ✓ Make the most of all the opportunities and challenges available
- ✓ Observe uniform codes
- ✓ Accept the consequences if you do not meet your responsibilities

Article 12: The right to an opinion and to be listened to

- ✓ Express opinions appropriately
- ✓ Participate actively and positively

Article 19: The right to protection

- ✓ Report bullying immediately
- ✓ Follow the Code of Conduct
- ✓ Seek help from an adult if needed
- ✓ Not to bring potentially harmful items to school
- ✓ Resist and report inappropriate peer pressure

Article 24: The right to health and a clean environment

- ✓ Respect resources
- ✓ Put effort into all physical activities
- ✓ Make good use of clubs and activities on offer

Both

- ✓ Have a positive attitude to learning
- ✓ Respect everyone in the classroom and in school
- ✓ Be organised and ready for learning and work
- ✓ Understand that all students have the right to an education free from disruption

- ✓ Support Student Voice
- ✓ Respect and consider others' views
- ✓ Respect and appreciate diversity
- ✓ Use constructive and respectful language
- ✓ Listen

- ✓ Support each other's physical and emotional safety
- ✓ Respect privacy
- ✓ Promote e-safety in and out of school
- ✓ Encourage respectful relationships
- ✓ Treat others the way you would wish to be treated

- ✓ Respect the physical environment of the school
- ✓ Keep the school clean
- ✓ Save energy
- ✓ Reduce, reuse and recycle
- ✓ Walk, cycle or use public transport to school if possible

Staff

- ✓ Make lessons as interesting as possible
- ✓ Have a positive approach to teaching
- ✓ Meet the needs of different learning styles
- ✓ Be fair
- ✓ Help students progress and reach their potential
- ✓ Challenge and extend

- ✓ Consult as appropriate
- ✓ Explain decisions
- ✓ Take time to assist students seeking advice
- ✓ Take ideas from students

- ✓ Provide a physically and emotionally safe working environment
- ✓ Be able to signpost students for help if needed
- ✓ Create a climate of confidence and trust that encourages students to share concerns and seek help

- ✓ Make available drinking water, healthy food, soap and first aid in school
- ✓ Provide education on health, global and environmental issues
